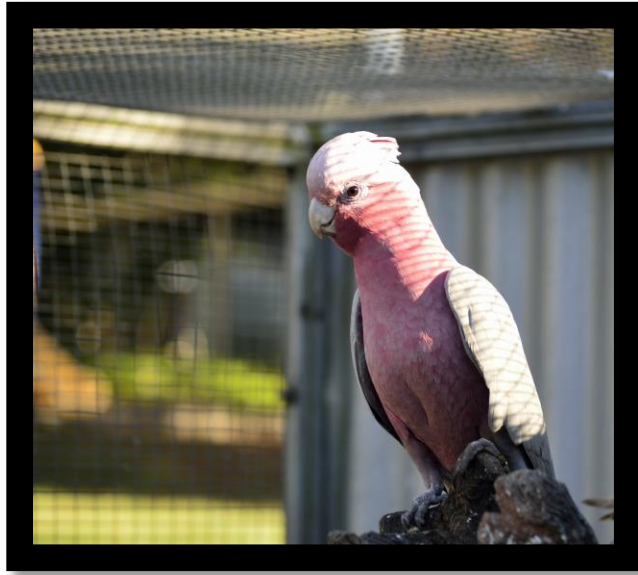


Meet The Animals

Did you know?

- Pink and grey Galahs can be found in most parts of Australia
- Highly intelligent, very social and adaptable these birds can make their home almost anywhere and they can mate for life and will often bond with humans
- In the wild Galahs generally live to about 30 years of age but in captivity they live as long as 80 years
- It is a highly friendly bird that is often seen in flocks with up to 1,000 birds
- Galahs eat seeds, grains, fruits, nuts, berries, grasses, roots, leaf buds, green shoots, and insects
- Galahs are monogamous – that means they mate for life
